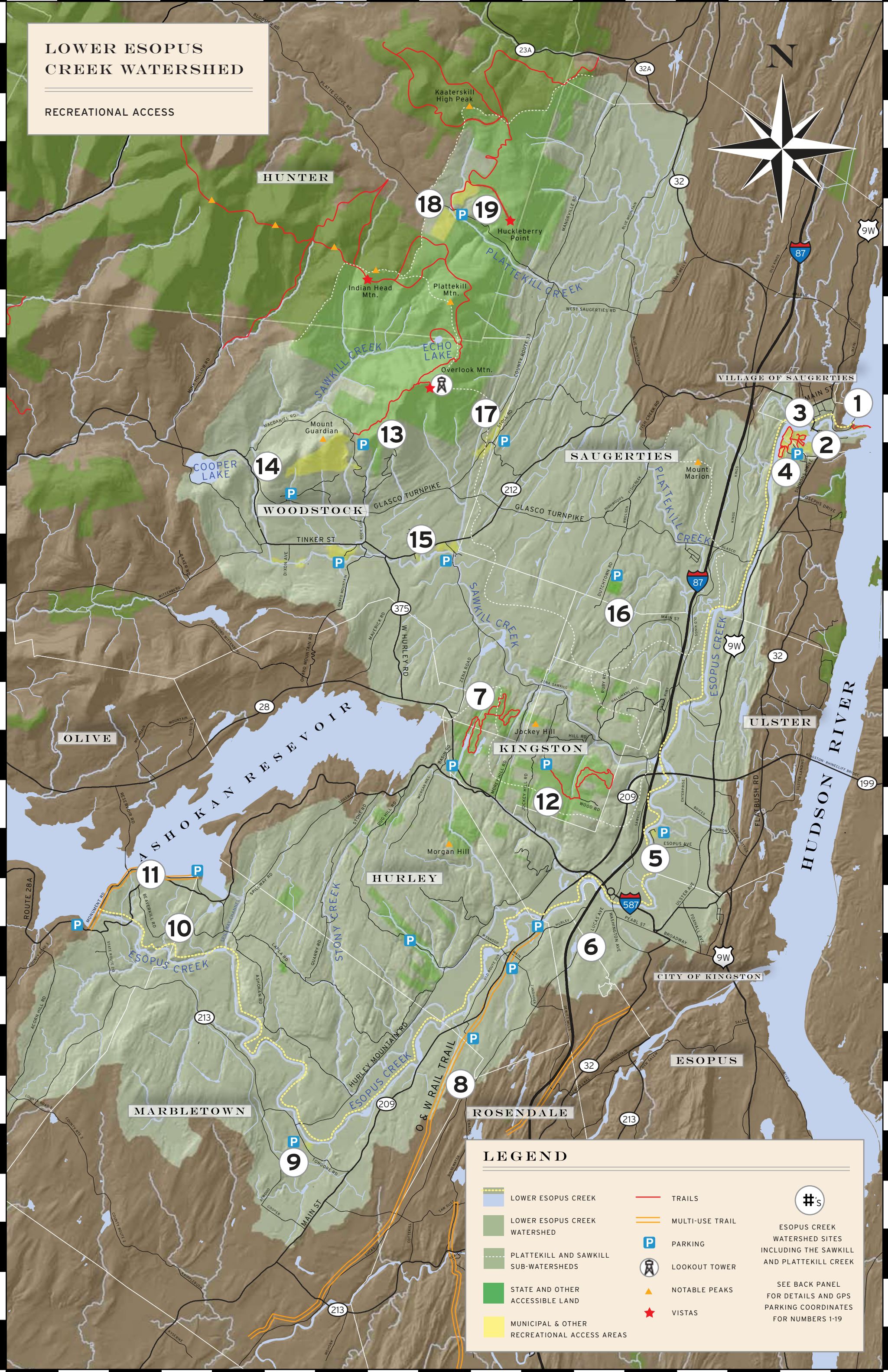


LOWER ESOPUS CREEK WATERSHED

SAUGERTIES LIGHTHOUSE



A short trail leads to this historic landmark; access to Hudson River and tidal portion of Lower Esopus

TINA CHORVAS PARK



Waterfront park with access to the tidal portion of Lower Esopus; view of Hudson River; occasional events; portable toilets

SAUGERTIES BEACH



Swimming beach (July 1 - Aug; 10am-6pm daily) on the non-tidal Lower Esopus; rest rooms; short walk from the village

ESOPUS BEND NATURE PRESERVE



161-acre nature preserve with a mile of shoreline access to the non-tidal Lower Esopus; occasional programs & guided walks; portable toilets

TOWN OF ULSTER ORLANDO ST. BALL PARK AND ESOPUS CREEK ACCESS



Easy access to the Lower Esopus, only creek access between Marbletown & Saugerties, minutes from the City of Kingston

FORSYTH NATURE CENTER & PARK



18.5-acres adjacent to Dietz Stadium complex; trails, animal exhibits, pavilion, restrooms, and gardens in the City of Kingston

ONTEORA LAKE TRAILS (Bluestone Wild Forest)



Network of trails and water bodies in the Catskill Park west of Kingston; ADA-accessible amenities in the Bluestone Wild Forest; portable toilets

O & W RAIL TRAIL



Over 12-miles of multi-use trail (paved at the northern end) with many access points along Route 209 in Hurley

At Tongore Rd, April - October; lifeguard from July-Aug, 10:30am-6pm; pavilion, fields, horseshoes, restrooms

Educational Programs and Special Events for the Public (Ashokan-Turnwood covered bridge; Esopus Gorge)

NYCDEP PUBLIC ACCESS AREA



Paved, level, multiple use trail from Olivebridge Dam to picnic/kiosk area at the "Frying Pan"; incredible views; access to aerator water fountain nearby; portable toilets

BLUESTONE WILD FOREST



Jockey Hill Trails for mountain biking; nearby Onteora Lake for fishing/paddling/primitive camping; 5 miles west of City of Kingston

to Overlook Fire Tower, Magic Meadow, Echo Lake, Primitive Bicycle Corridor between Meads Mtn and Platte Clove Roads

Access this kid-friendly peak and great view through the Byrdcliffe Art Colony (park at the Byrdcliffe Theatre and walk to trailhead)

HIGH WOODS MULTIPLE USE AREA



43-acre State Forest near Mt Marion; short hiking trail

SLOAN GORGE PRESERVE



88-acre preserve owned by Woodstock Land Conservancy; interpretive trail through mixed forest, wetlands, old bluestone quarries, unique geology

PLATTE CLOVE PRESERVE



206-acre preserve owned by The Catskill Center; interpretive hiking trails, waterfalls, access north and south to thousands of acres of Catskill Forest Preserve

Access to terrific views and wilderness of Indian Head Mtn (3,573') and entire Devil's Path, and north to Huckleberry Point (2,500') and Kaaterskill High Peak (3,655')
